In the project Sustainable Russia - Paths to a Climate-Neutral Economy, the Centre for Liberal Modernity has been investigating potentials and concepts for an ecological modernisation of Russia for the past two years. The renewed war of aggression against Ukraine has fundamentally changed the premises of this project and, at least for the time being, taken away the ground from strategies for an ecological modernisation of Russia.

In conclusion, we therefore want to discuss together with German and Russian economic, energy and climate experts, what economic and ecological future lies ahead for Russia and what the climate policy consequences of the Russian invasion of Ukraine are.

Since 24 February 2022, Russia has not only been at war with Ukraine, but also with its own future. The aim of the expert discussion is to assess Russia's medium-term economic and ecological situation. Furthermore, we ask under which conditions a resumption of cooperation in the field of climate policy and ecological modernisation could be possible.
